



REGISTERED NURSING

72 Credit Hours

The A.S. Degree in Registered Nursing (ADN-RN) focuses on the nursing process; pharmacology; nursing care for adult, pediatric, aged, and pregnant patients in healthy states as well as with disorders and disease states; leadership and management for the registered nurse; as well as issues and trends that affect the professional registered nurse including career management.

This is a limited access program. **Applications are accepted July 1 to October 1 each year.**

Training can be completed in two (2) years (prerequisites included).

CLASS TIMES: Classes meet three days a week. Clinical rotation hours vary. Additional days for clinical hours may be required each week.

CERTIFICATION: Successful completion of the A.S. Degree in Registered Nursing prepares graduates to take the National Licensure Examination for Registered Nurses (NCLEX-RN). A passing score on this exam and registration with the Florida State Board of Nursing enables graduates to seek employment as a Registered Nurse (RN) in the state of Florida.

PROGRAM INFORMATION

ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS

1. Be at least 18 years of age
2. Be in good academic standing if previously or currently enrolled at NFC
3. Basic computer skills
4. Satisfactory completion of placement test and college preparatory work
5. Successful completion of prerequisite courses
6. Mandatory orientation session.

PROGRAM LENGTH

Training can be completed in two (2) years (prerequisites included).

PROGRAM COST

Total cost is approximately \$7,800.

INCLUDES: tuition, supplies, uniforms, program patches, clinical name badge, books, testing package, state board application fee, and NCLEX testing fee.

- 4 **COMPLETE ASSESSMENT TESTS**
Complete HESI Admission Assessment (approx. \$54) by deadline. Schedule testing with NFC Testing Center, 850.973.9451 or testing@nfc.edu.
- 5 **COMPLETE ONLINE RN PROGRAM APPLICATION**
Complete online AS Degree in Registered Nursing program application by designated deadline.
- 6 **IF ACCEPTED INTO PROGRAM** Completion of background screening (\$60), drug screening (\$45), immunizations and physical information will be required and should be submitted to Tara Mesnard (mesnardt@nfc.edu or 850.973.1626) before program orientation.

Prior to admission in NFC Allied Health Programs, the student must have completed an FDLE, Level II security background investigation. The cost of the security background investigation is the responsibility of the student.
